In Summary:

17,248 HH have benefitted from the reported distribution of emergency shelter items
8,676 HH have benefitted from the reported distribution of essential household items
1,230 HH have benefitted from technical support

*NP:

There is a substantial overall distribution gap of 7,368 HH for this TC Harold response, with Luganville showcasing the most significant gap for the area councils. The shelter relief stocks that were consigned to the NDMO (of which we have not received reports of distribution) could have benefitted an additional 3,100 HH to 5,000 HH. This still leaves a considerable number of HH that need shelter support, especially for the 2020 to 2021 cyclone season. Shelter agencies are encouraged to keep these gaps in mind when developing shelter programs in the area councils with significant gaps highlighted in the table above.

Remarks:

- the above table is auto generated from the 3Ws Information that was provided to the SCT by shelter agencies in Vanuatu.
- the cells that are empty in the gaps column, indicate where the amount of emergency shelter distribution exceeds the # of HH damaged & destroyed. Updated assessment data has not been made available to the SCT in these instances.
- the # of HH highlighted in blue under the "Total # of HH reached with Technical Support" column was changed (from the previous report) to reflect the corrected #of HH that have benefitted from this activity.
