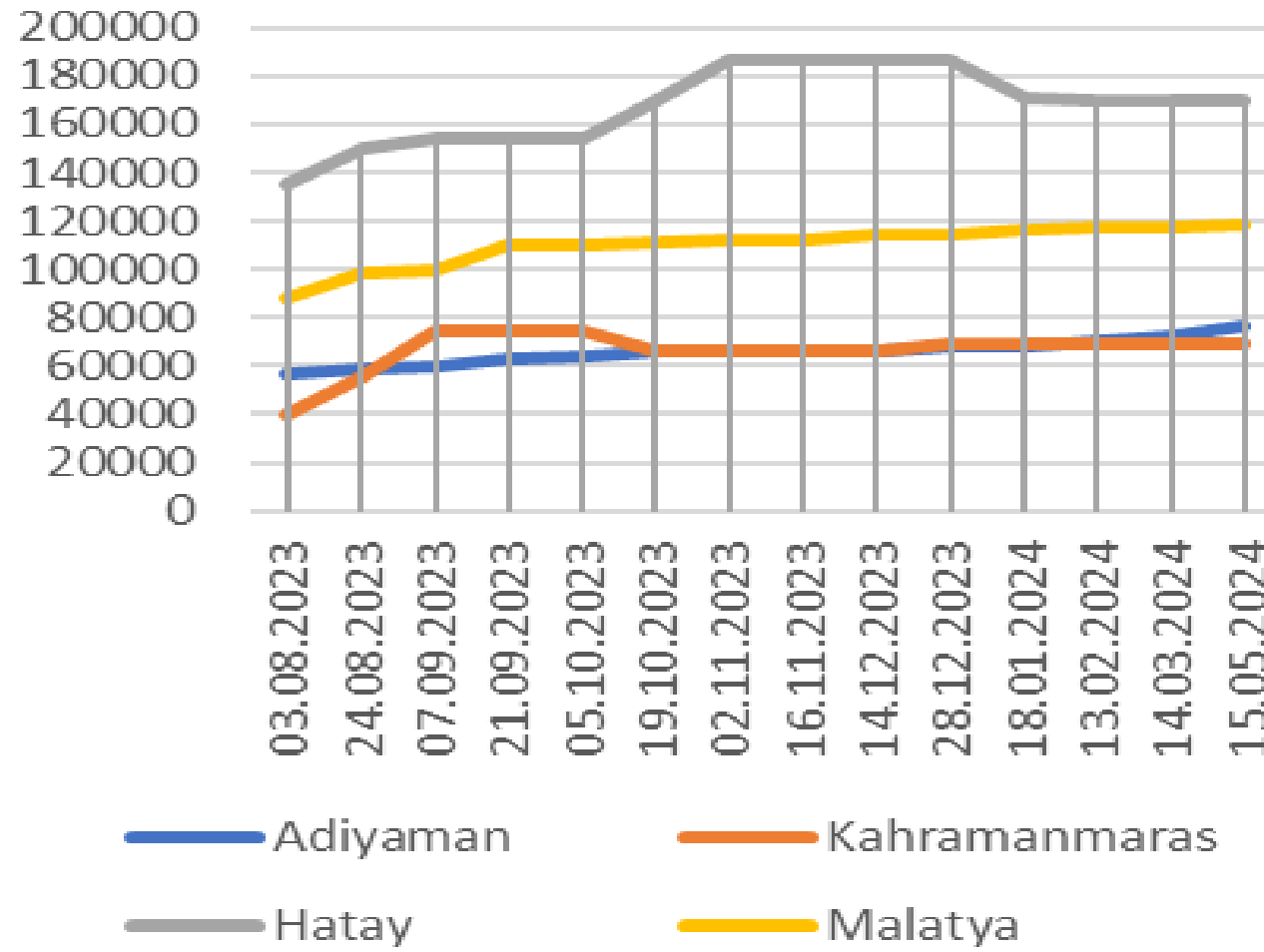

## Situational Overview

Overall, there has been a **40% reduction in people residing in informal settlements** since October 2023, half of whom are in Hatay. A UNHCR field assessment in May 2024 reported fewer than 2,000 refugees living in informal sites with 10 or more households, though individual tents are still scattered throughout various neighborhoods.

**Community Benefit Programme** by İŞKUR, known as Toplum Yararına Programı (TYP) will be coming to an end across all areas, with a gradual phase-out in the coming months, at varying paces across provinces.

## Situational Overview

**The rent support** provided by AFAD to earthquake survivors since April 2023 is ending in June. Over 170,000 households have benefited from the monthly rent assistance. The termination of this assistance may become significant challenge to the most vulnerable families in accessing basic needs.

**Closure of container Sites:** there are a number of overlapping interrelated efforts by authorities to consolidate and decongest sites. including relocations and closures of informal settlements, consolidation and incentivized movements out of Temporary Accommodation Centers (TACs) and consolidation of AFAD/governorship managed smaller container sites into larger sites (mostly visible in Hatay)

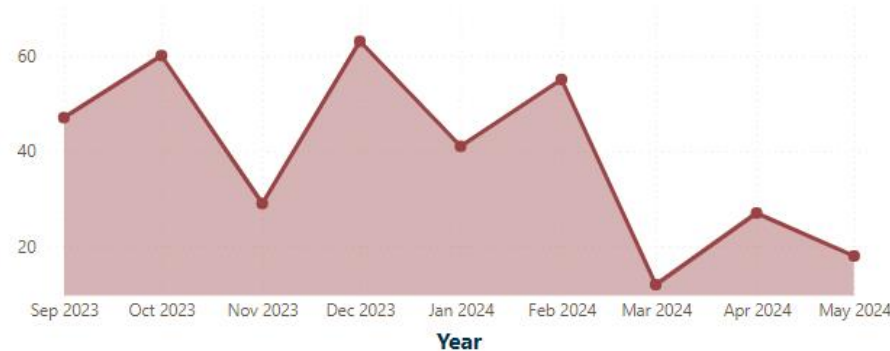

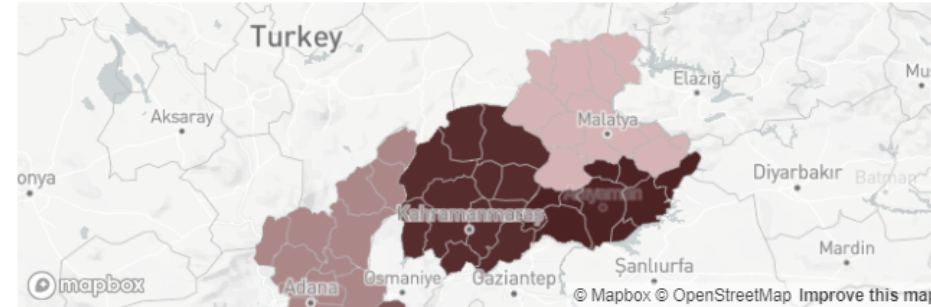

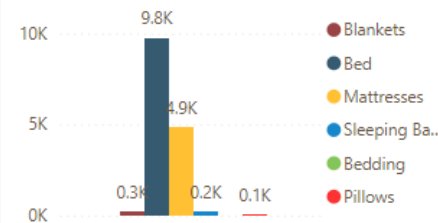


# HH reached with assistance to improve their interior living conditions (cumulative)

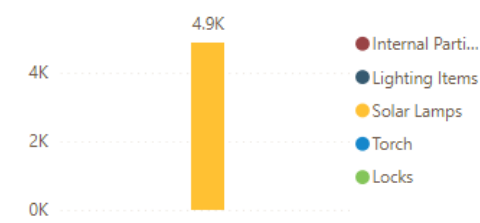

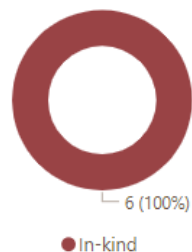

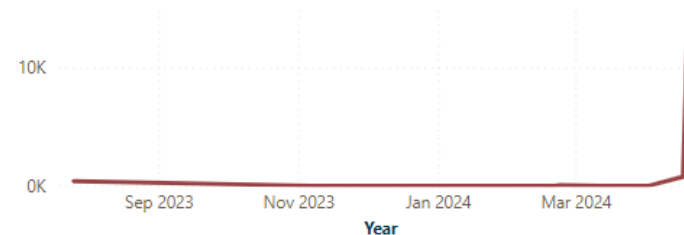

# SUMMER RESPONSE PLAN






## Inter-Sectoral Summer Response Plan

The Shelter sector was part of the Summer Response Plan prepared by ABC.  
The overall identified funding **gap is 25.8 million**.

The plan aims to support effective coordination and collective understanding on the scope of feasible summer response, including when messaging to local counterparts as well as to support resource mobilization and/or flexibility within existing donor agreements.

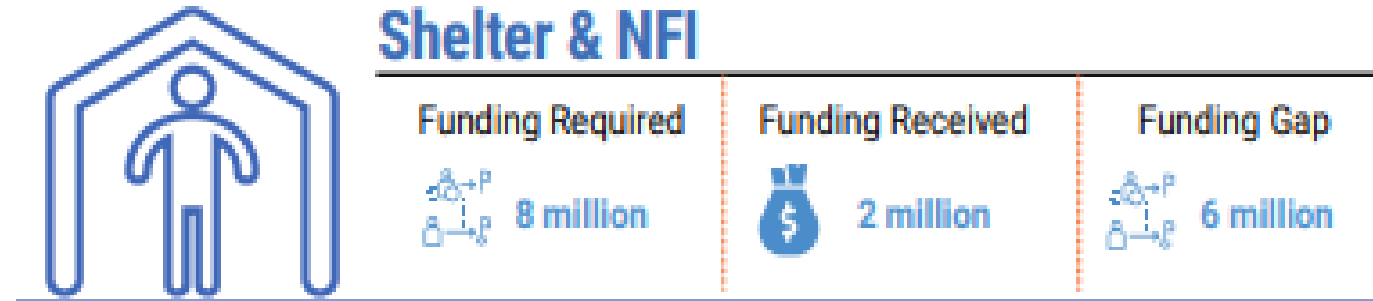

## Inter-Sectoral Summer Response Plan

### Shelter:

**\$8,000,000 Funding required**

**Targeting:** The Shelter Sector prioritized the formal sites that are not AFAD containers, which account for approximately **35,000 HH**. Assuming an average household size of four persons, the targeted number of people is calculated to be **140,000**.



# Inter-Sectoral Summer Response Plan

## Response Modality:

**Preferred Modality:** Cash-assistance for summer seasonal support.

- **Timing:** Carefully time cash distributions to promote expenditure on summer-related needs.
- **Messaging:** Provide households with guidance on using cash for summer-specific items and recommendations on what to purchase.

## Alternative Modalities:

- **Vouchers:** Consider using vouchers where appropriate.
- **In-Kind:** Resort to in-kind distribution in remote locations with limited market access or in cases of special vulnerabilities.

# HUB COORDINATION UPDATES

**58 Container sites – 24,682 Containers - 72,074 Indv. + (Akpinar site: 1400 containers, 5006 Indv.)**

**Rural: 11,973 containers - 48,380 Indiv.**

**Total Individuals in containers: 120,454 (21,020 HH)**

### **Earthquake Houses:**

- Most houses built lack infrastructure and furniture. Companies generally delay infrastructure development until the end to avoid damage during construction. and people are not expected to move in until infrastructure improvements are made.
- Recipients of new houses are chosen randomly with no criteria prioritizing disabilities or special needs,
- Most completed houses are village houses, with a few in Adiyaman city center. Another round of the permanent housing lottery is expected by the end of June.
- Residents of container sites who received houses were notified on June 15 to vacate the container sites.

### **Future of container sites:**

- AFAD plans to container sites by relocating remaining residents to another container site based on land value and size.
- Empty containers will be moved to other earthquake-prone areas as part of a preparedness plan for future disasters.
- Some smaller sites will be closed, and people will be moved to larger ones like K-13.

### **Repairs of lightly damaged dwellings:**

- Many houses registered as lightly damaged have significant issues, such as collapsed walls, particularly on ground floors. Therefore, not all lightly damaged dwellings are truly lightly damaged.
- AFAD welcomed the inclusion of NGOs in the repairs activity and recommended to focus efforts on urban areas, as targeting rural areas has less need and impact.

### **Needs and partners' observation:**

- K-13 has three sections, each capable of hosting about 1,100 households. While the infrastructure of section C is complete, containers have not yet been installed. AFAD plans to relocate people to the K-13 container site after closing smaller sites.
- TRC addressed additional needs for the K-13 container site, including shading and communal social spaces, such as playgrounds for children.
- Pest control, latrine facilities, water filtration units, and communal shading are urgently needed.

55 container sites- 22,425 Containers - 69,031 indiv. - TAC hosting 14,000 TP.

16,996 containers in rural areas - 13,150 foldable containers

- Housing requirement in the hub was identified at 112,414 housing units. As of March 2024, a mere 19,501 houses have been allocated to residents. Despite assurances from Local authorities that the relocation of affected people will be finalized in June, little progress has been made.
- AFAD has indicated that those who have received keys to their houses are no longer entitled to rental assistance and need to leave the containers as soon as possible.
- Provision of air conditioning in container cities remains unfulfilled. Additionally, the need for Mosquito nets and screens and shaded areas (communal) persist.

**15,022 Containers in rural areas – 45.459 Ind.**

- Evacuation of informal tent areas in Kirkhan and Hassa has been completed, people moved either to Saricam or Hilalkent.
- A coordination meeting with the deputy governor was held on 4th of June, the needs expressed are as follows:
  - Repairs of roofs and walls of containers
  - Floor repairs for 1,176 containers
  - Water purification devices
  - Infrastructure and superstructure works

74 Container sites (52 in city center – 22 in rural areas) – 29,316 containers – 33,080 HH - 117,622 indiv.

### Earthquake houses:

- 88,000 houses allocated to affected families. 30,000 will benefit from Emlak Konut and the rest will benefit from reserve areas.
- There will be rental support for those living in the allocated reserve areas if their houses will be demolished.
- A total of 7,000 houses were delivered to the beneficiaries, of those, 900 are still in container sites. Families living in rural areas are encouraged to move to their new houses by the end of this month. No pressure on those living in city center.



### **Closure of container sites:**

- No clear plan yet, but smaller-sized sites are expected to be closed by the end of the year.
- For vacant places in container cities, relocation will be done according to vulnerability criteria (disability, and elderly people).
- Samankoy container city will be closed due to the end of the rental agreement.
