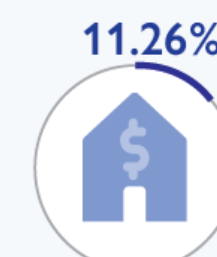


- Three months into the SAF-RSF conflict, close to **4 million people** have been forced to flee their homes, continuing the same upward trend.
- Out of those, the estimated number of IDPs across Sudan is **3 million**. The current assessment has observed the IDP caseload in all of Sudan's 18 states. The highest proportions of IDPs have been observed in **River Nile** (15.48%), **Northern** (11.95%), **North Darfur** (9.83%), and **White Nile** (9.01%) states.
- While to close to **1 million** people have crossed into neighbouring countries.

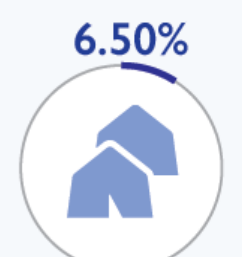
Shelter categories



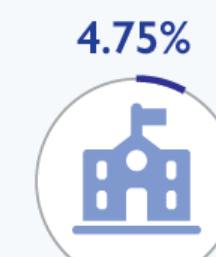

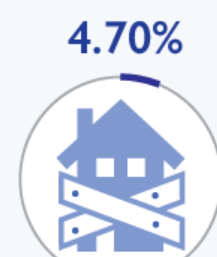

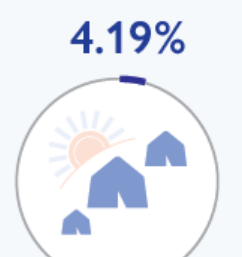

- Final refinement of ES drawings and BoQs ongoing – once finalized it will be shared with the broader cluster membership for comments.
 - Guidance note on the installation of ESKs and best practice on risk reduction still pending.

- This document takes a **two-fold approach** to systematizing Post Distribution Monitoring (PDM) in the Shelter and NFI Cluster in Sudan.
- Firstly, it presents a **standardized framework** and emphasizes benefits of utilizing **shared digital tools** to consolidate PDM efforts at cluster level and unlock the potential for **collective learning**.
- Secondly, it offers **technical advice** and **practical guidance** for successfully **conducting PDM exercises** across the five key stages of the process.
- Initial round of feedback by **was incorporated** pre-April 15, but it will be **re-shared** in case further adjustments are needed to the current situation.
- Please make sure to comment both on the **guidance document** and the **concept of the Common Approach** as well as the **KoBo tool itself**.
- Next steps – **translation to Arabic** once finalized.

Objective: Ensure that our collective response efforts are well communicated to partners, donors, media and general audiences!

- **Achievements** – type of interventions, HH reached, locations, timeframe, etc.
 - **Challenges** – looting of supplies, access challenges, etc.
 - **Procurement** – quantities of stocks arriving to the country, type of stocks, timeframe, where will the stocks be prepositioned – particularly given the incoming flood season.
 - **Assessments** – e.g., needs assessments outlining specifics with respect to Shelter and NFI needs as well as market assessments on NFIs, shelter materials, or Cash for Rent.
 - **Context and impact** of interventions – e.g., any successes with respect to cash for rent, how is sustainability achieved, what about tenure security?
 - **Interventions in the host community** – with 77% of the population staying in host community – what has been achieved so far? Cash for shelter for the families hosting IDPs can be an option, or preselecting landlords to improve their housing in order for them to subsidize rent for IDPs – this can include negotiating longer-term tenure security.

Update from Gedaref



- 35 Rakoubas were constructed
- 211 ESKs were distributed
- 252 HHs received plastic sheets for shelter improvement
- Rainy Season Preparedness:
 - 10,100 M micro drainage were desilted
 - 2,000 M drainage were excavated
 - 80 wooden bridge were constructed
 - 50 culverts were desilted



Other States Updates:

- In Al Gazirah, 136 NFI kits were distributed
- In ND, 4,582 HHs of IDPs received Mats
- In Kassala, 53 NFI kits were distributed to new IDPs and 800 kits for returnees
- In Wadi Halfa, 220 NFI kits were distributed to new the IDPs
- In WNS, 550 NFI kits were distributed

Cross Border Delivery – Darfur Response

From Dubai via airlifting to Ndjamena via road to Farchana

- ☐ Total Kits is 10,000
- ☐ Two rub halls are completed, other two in progress
- ☐ All flights from Dubai have arrived Ndjamena
- ☐ Three consignments
- ☐ First one arrived Farchana
- ☐ Arrival of the second and third consignments at Farchana is expected on 8 and 11 August
- ☐ 4,500 kits are allocated under the new SHF project



Challenges

- Rainy season, access to the camps and new sites
- NFI release/clearance process has been very complex and unpredictable
- Lack of shelter materials in the local markets
- Internet Connection and Communication

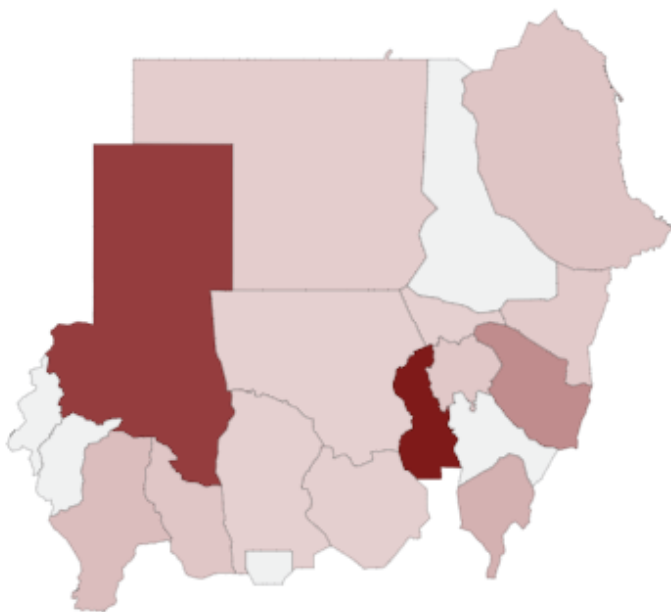

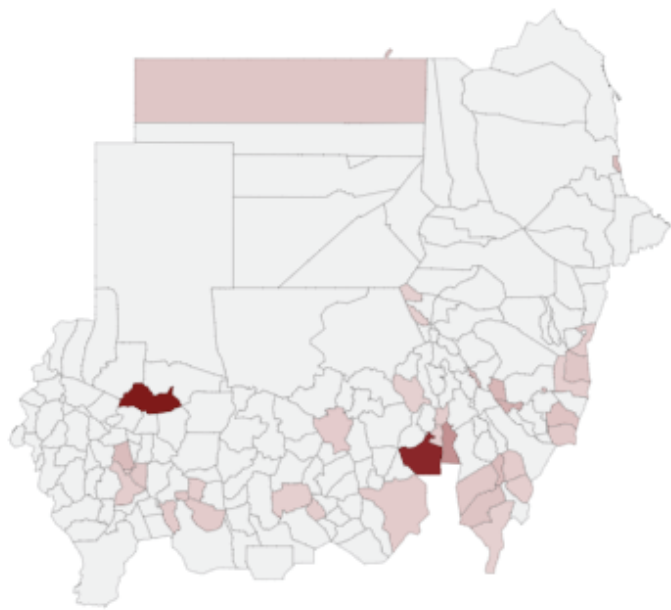

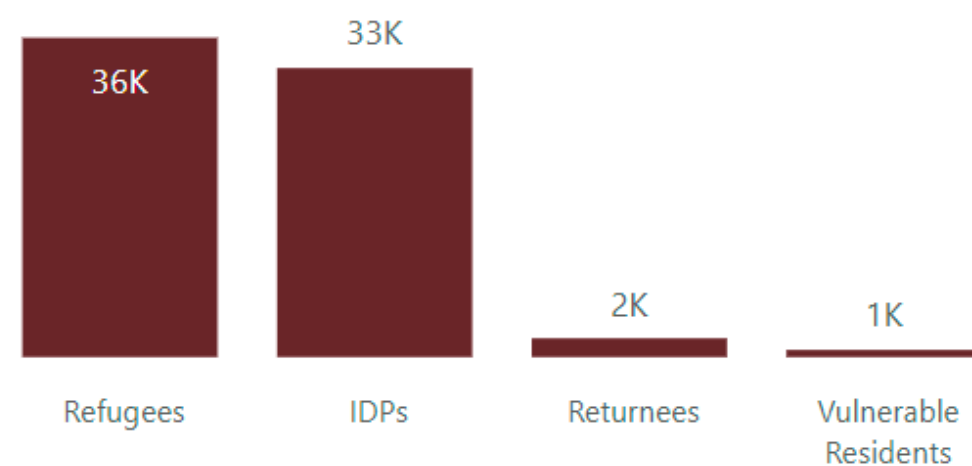
Household Reached by Response Type

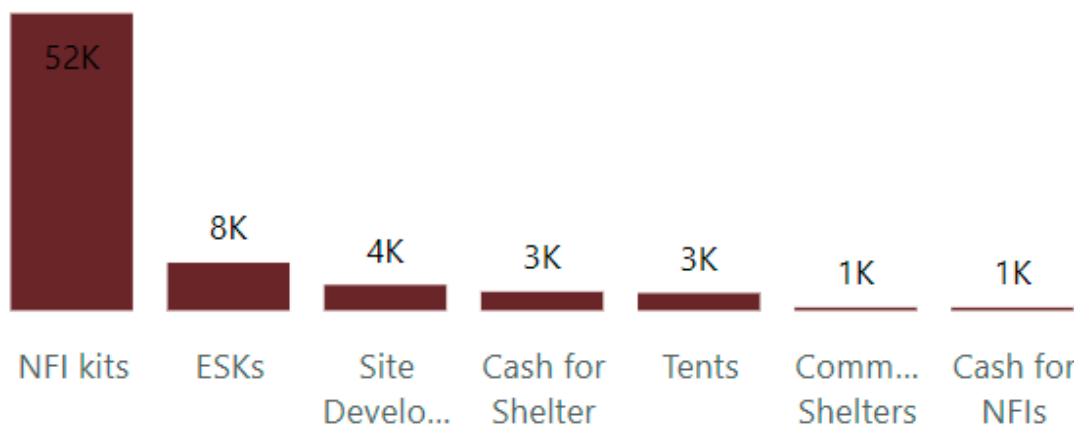

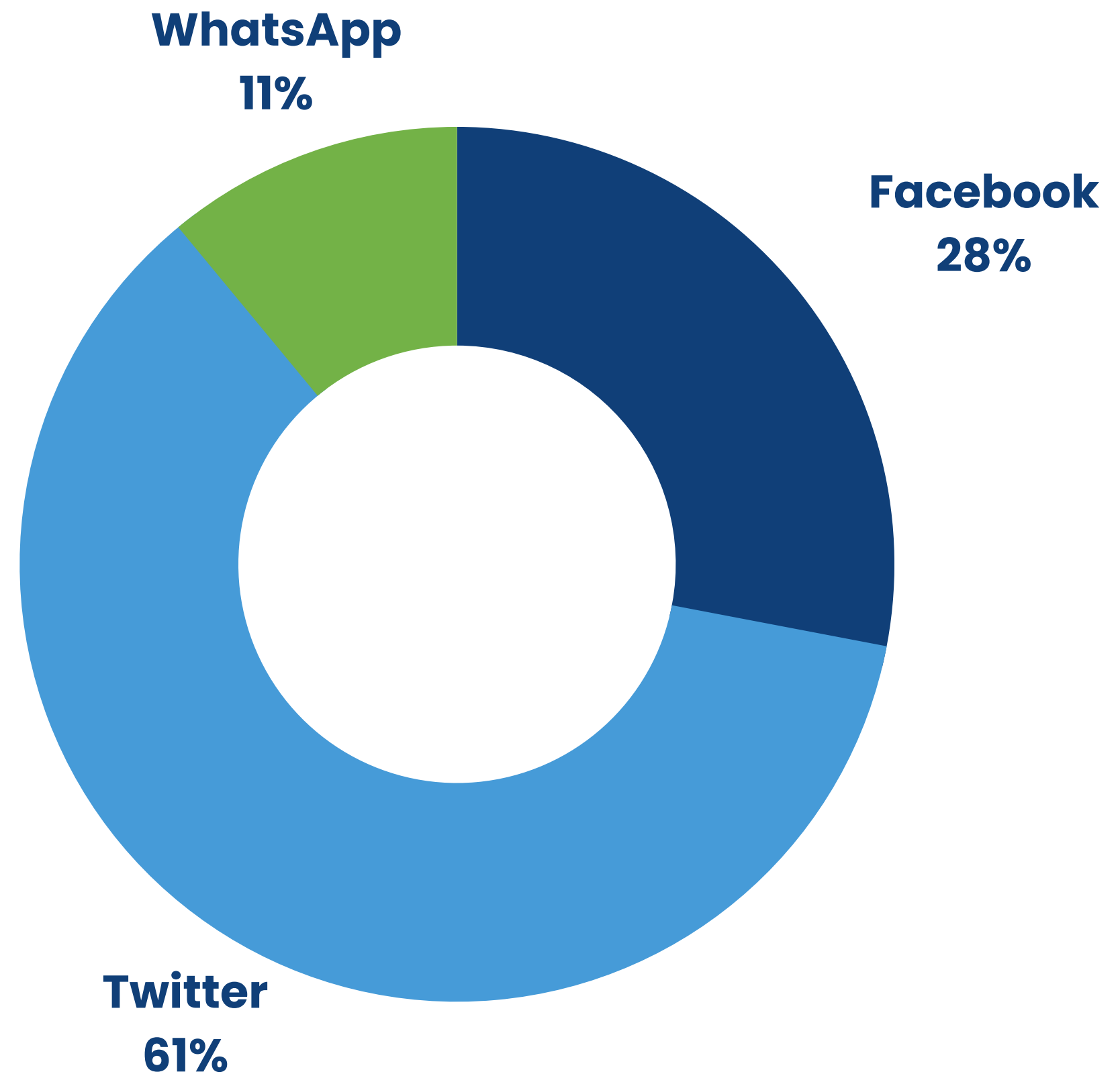
Social Media Trends, 23 July to 3 August

- A team of 18 MSF personnel attacked again, by armed men
- People are asking about where the aid is going as they are not receiving it, and are accusing a government official of selling the aid
- Residents of AlKalakla besieged and expelled from their homes
- Residents ordered to evacuate their homes in Jabra and Arkweet with reports of looting

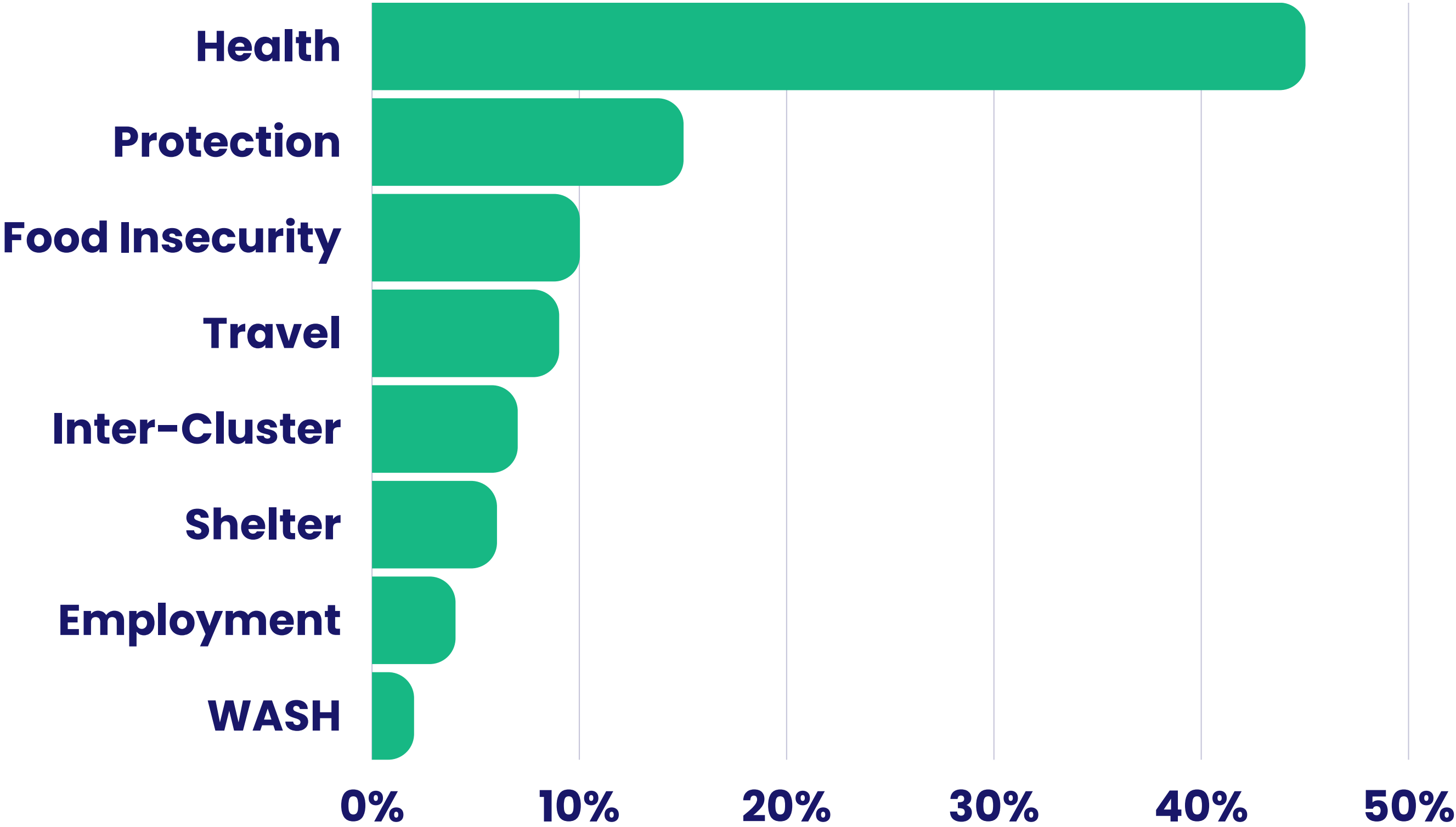
Social Media Trends, 23 July to 3 August

- Fear of famine in Sudan, as farmers are unable to farm due to conflict and water shortages
- Calls for health support (medicine and blood donation) are ongoing (Madani, Khartoum, Omdurman, and AlDuwaim), with lack of mental health medications reported by the Sudan Professional Pharmacists Association

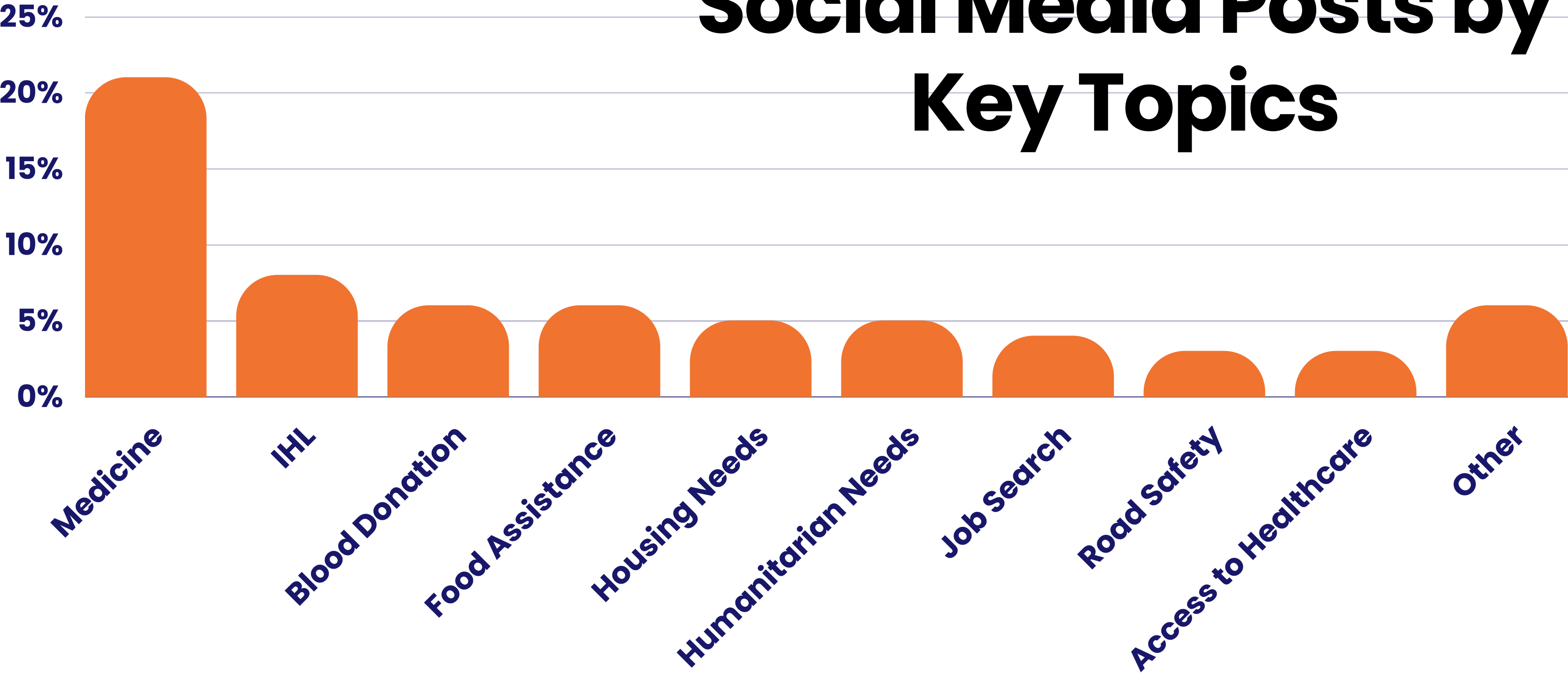
Social Media Platforms Breakdown

Housing Needs

- Individuals on social media are looking for organizations/individuals to help cover their rent
- The longer the displacement the more difficult it is for families to cover their rent expenses
- Expulsion from homes leading to displacement

Housing Needs

- People's needs for shelter differed between those who wanted a house for one night, and those who wanted a house at reasonable prices for a sick family member
- Some people have indicated their interest in furnished apartments.

Response to Housing Needs

- On Facebook, people respond of housing needs by sharing the specifications of the apartments and their prices, and numbers for communication and inquiries. Some people respond by sharing a link for investment group on Telegram, while some responded privately.
- Noticed that on Facebook people post their needs for homes in groups for general inquiries, such as "Wasif li Madani."
- On Twitter, people responded to AI-shelter needs by retweeting.

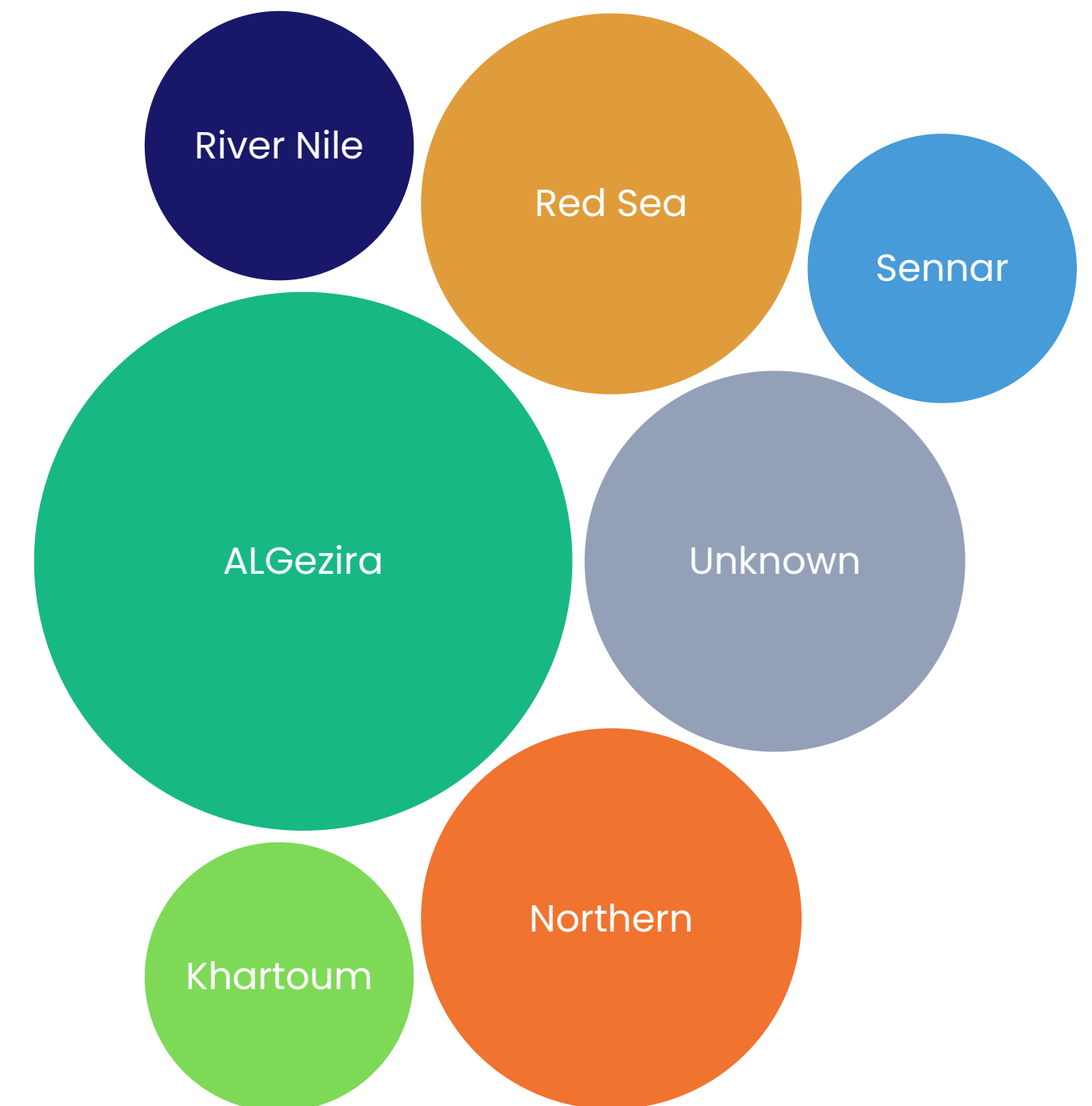

Travel/Relocation Support

Information about **safe routes** and **bus tickets** for people fleeing or returning to Khartoum continue to be an information need.

information about **travel procedures** and the **renewal of travel documents** is a key information need

People responded of road safety

Some people shared updates on road safety

Some referred to the use of buses as a safer method than private vehicles

Some responded to queries from individuals on social media who are asking if it's safe to leave Khartoum with their private vehicle

Food Insecurity

Vulnerable groups face dire food insecurity, such as children, older people, and people with disabilities, and single-headed families and families who have lost their breadwinners.

“We have neighbors, a family consisting of a blind father, his wife is old, and their son has an amputated leg due to diabetes. They do not have food for their day, they need a helping hand. A family that does not ask for support, not even from the neighbors.
