Research provides an essential evidence base to the work of the GSC

"There needs to be evidence to support quality".

"thinking beyond the short term, the avoidance of repeated mistakes and adaptation to local context".

Shelter and settlement interventions, however, remain an under-researched aspect of humanitarian response (Peacock, Dash and Zhang, 2007; Twigg, 2002; Maynard, Parker and Twigg 2017;).

Widespread appreciation of the link between research, quality and accountability.

Causal research questions and **comparative research** questions were mentioned as the most useful types of questions for **strategic planning and advocacy**.

Descriptive questions which are useful in the **early stages of a response**.






