

Overview

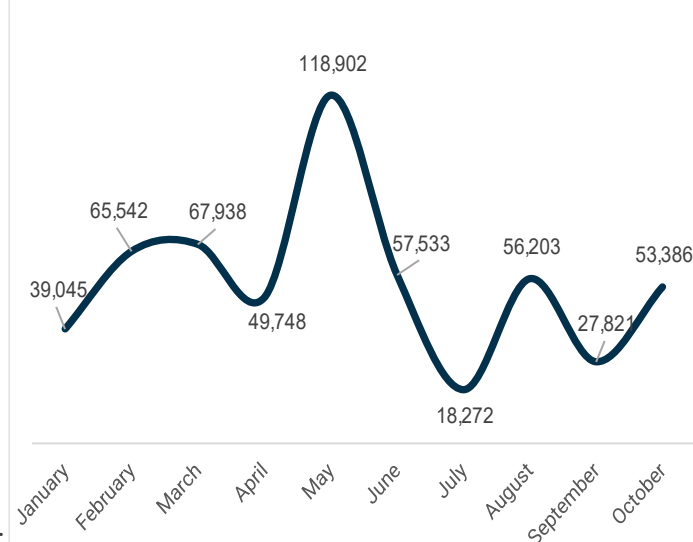
In Afar, towards the end of October, 2,225 households have been displaced across six kebeles of the Dulecha woreda in Gabi /Zone 3 due to flooding of the Kebenna and Awash rivers. The displaced households urgently need food, shelter, NFIs, and other assistance. Meanwhile, amid the high food insecurity and malnutrition situation in Afar, the ES/NFI needs of more than 200K returnees in Kilbati/Zone 2, Fanti/-Zone 4 and Awsi/Zone 1 remains a top priority for the ES/NFI Cluster.

In Amhara, the Region's humanitarian response to the needs of close to 400K returnees and around 66K IDPs, mainly in the North Shewa and South Wollo zones, remains minimal due to limited funding and access to some IDP sites. The implementation of humanitarian interventions, including ESNFI, continues to be coordinated with decisions on where and when to lift the suspension of food distributions. Drought is reported in North Gonodr and Wagehemera. The cluster is closely monitoring the displacement in these areas.

Flood-related displacements are reported in the Afder, Liben, and Shebele zones of Somali and South Omo, South regions. In addition to the recent flood, Ethiopia's south and southwest regions (Benishangul Gumz, Gambela, Oromia, Somali, and SNNP) host around 2.3M displaced by an overlapping and recurring crisis of conflict, drought, floods, and landslides. Almost half of life is in spontaneous sites, a third is in host communities, a tenth is in planned camps, and the rest is in collective centers and dispersed settlements. The shelter conditions are precarious across all these types of settlements, and NFI needs are critical.

In these regions, around half a million IDPs have returned to their places of origin, with 86% having returned more than six months ago. More recently are government-led return exercises in the Oromia region, which shows the return of around 231,753 individuals/41,897 HHs (27.61% of the total case-load in six zones) to their original locations in 24 woredas of the four zones in Oromia region: East, West, Horo Guduru Wollega, and West Showa zones.

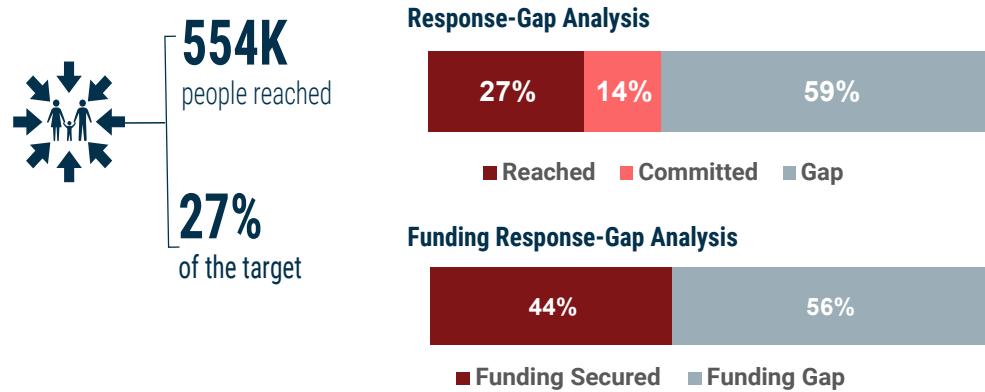

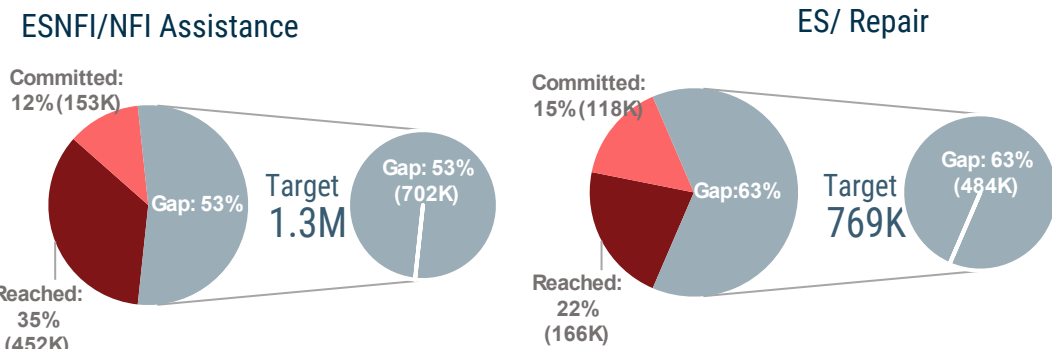

Response and Gap Analysis



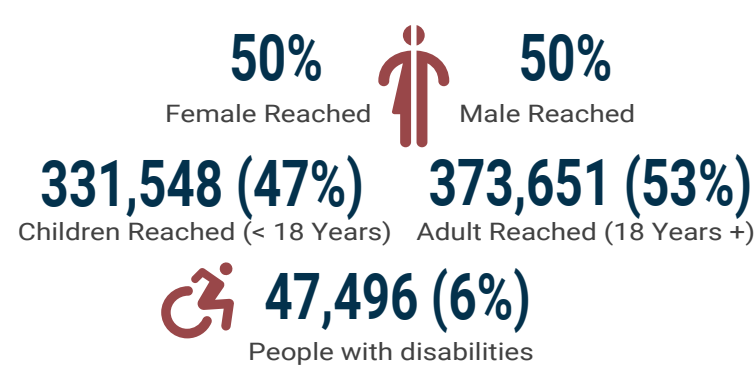
Response by Activity



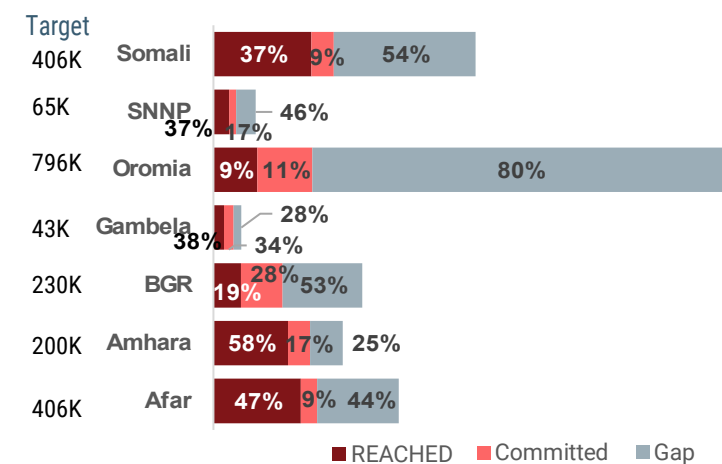

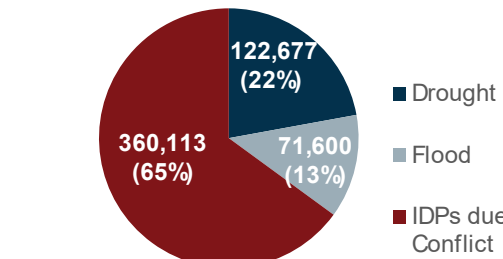
Reached By Demographics
