

In Amhara, the Region's humanitarian response to the needs of close to 400K returnees and around 66K IDPs, mainly in the North Shewa and South Wollo zones, remains minimal due to limited funding and access In these regions, around half a million IDPs have returned to their places of to some IDP sites. 


