TEMERGENCY SHELTER & NFI CLUSTER

The humanitarian situation in Amhara remains the ES/NFI Cluster concern, with 562k people in need of shelter and NFIs, of whom 396k are targeted for assistance. Living conditions in 33 IDP sites and collective centers, including those in North and South Wello, are severe due to prolonged use, overcrowding, and structural damage, leaving many shelters uninhabitable and further deteriorating the situation for IDPs. Overcrowding and maintenance issues persist, as shelters built four years ago designed for a short lifespan continue to accommodate IDPs without repairs. In Debre Birhan, overcrowding has overwhelmed resources, increasing protection risks, including GBV concerns.

Over the past two years, only a small number of IDPs, including those in host communities, have received NFI kits. The worsening security situation has further impacted livelihoods, particularly in Western Amhara including North, East, and West Gojam, as well as Awi zones leaving many without sustainable means of support. Despite urgent needs, slow progress and inactive humanitarian partners continue to hinder the response efforts due to resource shortages and operational constraints.

In Tigray, 18% of IDPs across 90 collective centers face severe overcrowding and a lack of privacy, posing serious health and protection risks. In Shire, schools accommodate IDPs far beyond their intended capacity, increasing the risk of disease outbreaks and worsening conditions, especially for women, children, and other vulnerable groups.


In Endabaguna, the IDP population has surged to 365% of the host population, straining essential services. The town's three collective centers remain critically overburdened, offering inadequate living conditions. In Tselemit, displaced individuals previously sheltered in host communities are now moving into overcrowded sites due to dwindling resources, further stretching limited services.

To address this, CCCM and humanitarian partners have begun relocating IDPs to Maidimu, where new shelters are under construction. Some IDPs from Endabaguna are willing to relocate, but due to funding constraints, further shelter development has stalled, leaving thousands in dire conditions with no viable alternatives.


