## **GUIDELINES AND INSTRUCTIONS**

- The objective of this exercise is to understand the displacement situation at the village level (including multi-sectoral needs of affected populations)
- This form is addressed to Resource Persons who possess knowledge on the situation and living conditions of displaced populations in the village where the data collection is being conducted.

#### Reminder:

Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs) are persons or groups of persons who have been forced or obliged to flee or to leave their homes or places of habitual residence, in particular as a result of, or in order to avoid the effects of armed conflict, situations of generalized violence, violations of human rights or natural or human-made disasters, and who have not crossed an internationally recognized State border

A *Returnee* is a person who was displaced internally or across an international border, but has since returned to his/her place of habitual residence

**Pendular displacements**: A form of displacement in which an IDP or a group of IDPs repeatedly move back and forth between their area of displacement and their place of habitual residence.

An *urban setting* corresponds to any locality with more than 5,000 inhabitants and with sufficient socio-economic and administrative infrastructures.

A *rural setting* corresponds to any locality with less than 5,000 inhabitants with little or no socio-economic and administrative infrastructure as well the main economic activity being agriculture.

- Make notes and identify resource persons from different organizations or IDP groups that can help get latest reliable information.
- Enumerators should be familiar with the village in which the data collection is being conducted, and always review the existing data regarding the locations and numbers of IDPs in the area. This questionnaire is just a tool to record the information. During the discussions with Resource Persons, enumerators should get the best possible information on the topics in the form.
  - \*Before starting the interview, enumerators must ask the resource persons whether they agree to proceed with the interview. If the Resource Person does not agree, terminate the interview.

Focus Group Discussions: Six to twelve maximum fifteen people are invited to discuss specific topics in detail. The focus group can bring together people who have something in common. They may share a particular problem, or be unable to speak up at larger meetings (for example, age diffrenciation; younger people from older people, sex diffrenciation; women from men, group diffrenciation; minority groups, PWDs etc), or are people only peripherally involved in the community, such as nomads. It is best not to have leaders or people in authority present – interview them separately.

### Filling in the questionaire:

For the answer options that have **boxes** to tick, you can chose more than one option while the answer options that have **circles** to tick, you can only chose one option.

For a site in a village which is hosting more than 20 IDP households, please fill in a separate form for that site (but take care not to double count (like schools and hospitals, which would be shared by populations in the site and the village hosting the site) For questions where you have the choice to select "AT MOST THREE OPTIONS", you can select between 1 and 3 options.
