

Situation Overview

The northern region of Mozambique continues to face increased and unpredictable displacement movements, due to constant security incidents. Between 22 December 2023 to 22 February 2024, attacks, and fear of attacks by Non-state Armed Groups in Macomia, Chiure, Mecufi, Mocimboa da Praia, and Muidumbe triggered the cumulative displacement of 64,941 individuals/13,935 families (DTM, Movement Alert #100, 23rd February 2024).

The Shelter Cluster plays a crucial role in addressing the pressing needs arising from conflict-induced displacement and is monitoring needs and closely coordinating with partners to ensure that the most adequate and rapid response solutions can be addressed.

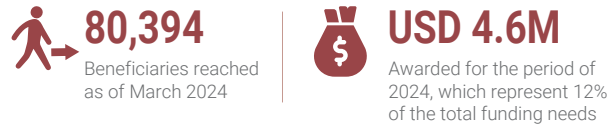
Given increasing needs and quickly depleting stock levels, Shelter Cluster and partners seek a continuous replenishment of Non-Food Items and support for Emergency Shelter assistance on urgent basis. Shelter Cluster partners are collectively working towards assisting nearly 373K conflict-affected individuals with Emergency Shelter and household NFI items. This assistance will be provided across displacement hotspots and return locations, utilizing a combination of mobile and static approaches.

This dashboard shows the first quarter of 2024 and is derived from the 5W reports submitted by partners, tracking their activities and responses across Northern Mozambique.

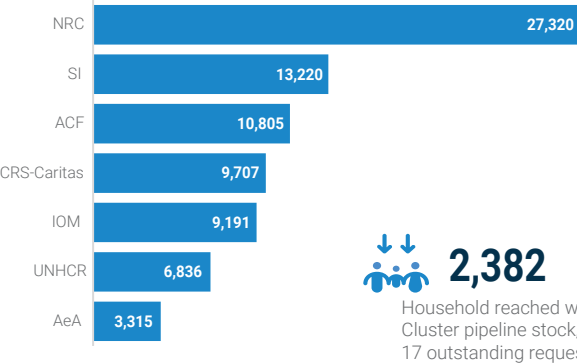

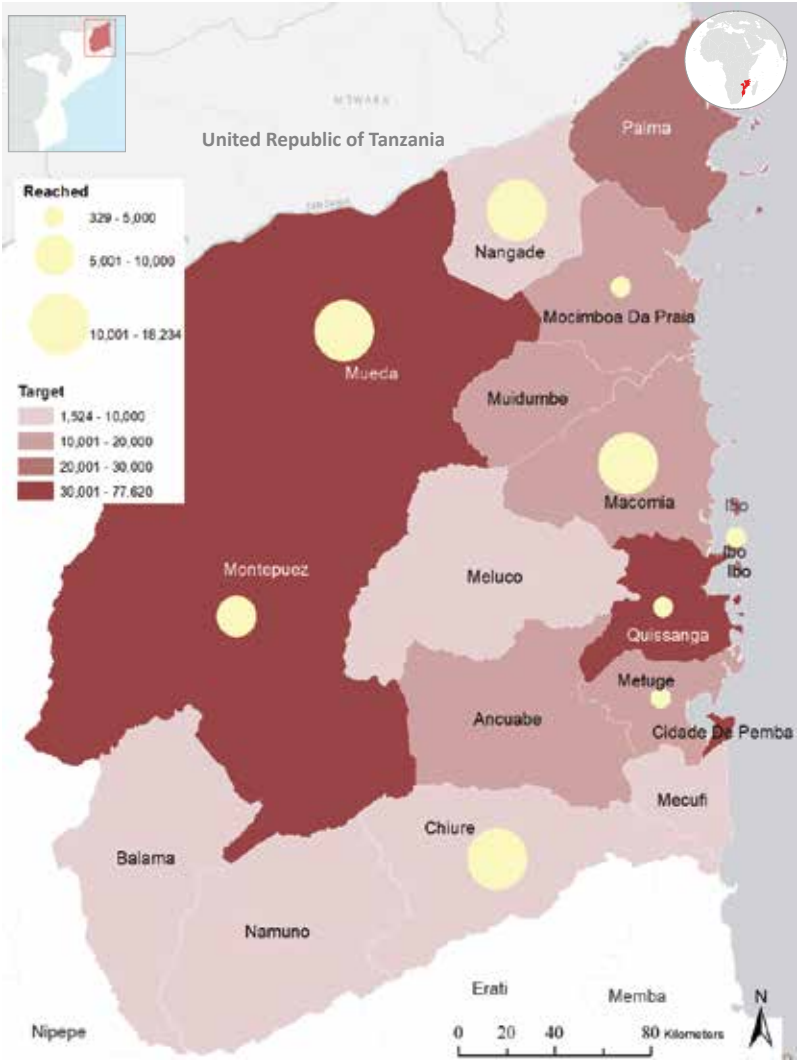

Beneficiaries by Partners



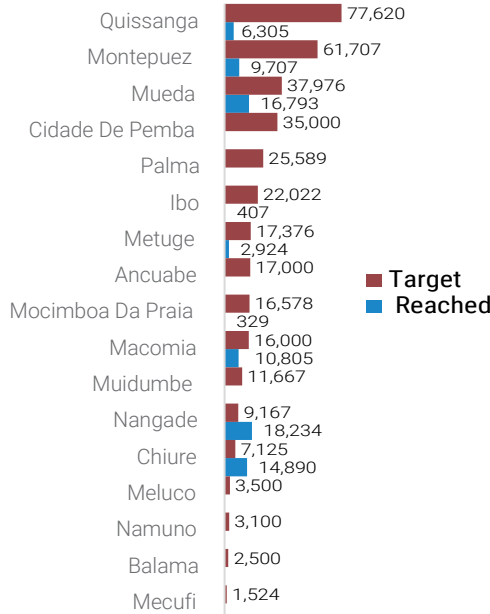
Response overview - Northern Mozambique

Limitations

The Shelter Cluster confronts the ongoing challenge of limited funding, this funding constraints impact the ability and capacity of partners to continue their operations and meet the urgent shelter needs of crisis-affected populations.

The Shelter pipeline is receiving requests from multiple partners to support responses in Nampula province as well as in other districts that have received new displacements in Cabo Delgado province and the shelter cluster foreseeing that if the numbers increase with the rate of requests and current displacements, partners' stocks and pipeline stock both will not suffice.
