

# **Situation Overview 2**

11 September 2024

Since 21 August 2024, continuous torrential rain and heavy water flow from the adjacent Indian states caused intense flooding in the 11 districts of the eastern and southeastern parts of Bangladesh. People of the eastern part of Bangladesh are not used to floods and it causes severe damage. Even though the flood waters have receded, a large part of areas are still inundated, creating access challenges in the areas. Based on the information received, a significant number of people are still staying in shelter centers. A humanitarian crisis has struck the flooded areas and affected people are living without their basic needs. Rural houses in this region are usually made of Corrugated Galvanized Iron (CGI) sheets and the plinth is mainly made of mud. Especially these types of houses have experienced extensive damage. According to the latest data (D form and SOS form), a total of 334,434 houses have been damaged in the flood-affected districts out of which 26,991 houses are destroyed and 307,443 houses are partially damaged. The current situation is very challenging for affected people, and they are insecure, and their dignity is being eroded. The rainy season is not over yet and winter is coming, this situation is making them increasingly more vulnerable and instantly the affected people need emergency shelter support. Apart from the damage to houses, many people have lost their daily essentials, it created more challenges for them to maintain their daily life.

So far, 44,950 people have been confirmed for shelter support, but this is very minimum compared to the need, many people are still out of support.

<u>Shelter Needs:</u> Currently affected families need cash support for reconstructing the houses, tarpaulin, tent, shelter toolkit, Corrugated Galvanized Iron, Bamboo, timber, HHs NFIs e.g. cloths, mosquito net, bed sheet, comforter, solar lamp and kitchen utensils.

### **Shelter Cluster recommendation:**

**Emergency Shelter Support:** Tarpaulins, tent, toolkits, and fixing materials along with technical guidance to the affected households from severe weather conditions.

**Essential Household Supplies:** Vital items e.g., clothing, mosquito nets, cooking utensils, solar lamp, candles fireboxes etc.

Cash Grants: Shelter-specific cash grants to affected households to repair/ reconstruct their shelters.

**House Repair Assistance:** House repair assistance with technical expertise on Build Back Safer to households needing to repair their damaged houses as well as in-kind or cash support for shelter modalities.

**Transitional/Core Shelter Support:** long-term shelter support with technical expertise on Build Back Safer, for secure, healthful, and private living environment that upholds the dignity of its residents through in-kind or cash for shelter modalities.

**Host Family Assistance:** Hosting support to both families and being hosted by friends, relatives, or neighbors which provides essential household item kits, cooking equipment, relocation aid, cash support programs, and assistance in expanding living spaces.

**Cash for Work:** cash for work at the HHs level for raising plinth of the severely affected vulnerable HHs, reconstruction of the HHs access road with females' participation etc.
