Earthquake Specific Needs & Response

- Damage Assessment: The residential buildings rapid damage assessment has been completed in Lattakia Governorate, is 80% complete in Aleppo Governorate, and 40% complete in Hama & Idleb. Phase II of the structural assessment to verify needed structural repairs for buildings identified to have structural damages has been initiated in Lattakia and Aleppo Governorates.
- Mid-Term Settlements: Site preparation and installation of prefab housing units, funded by the UAE Red Crescent, are ongoing in 7 locations in Lattakia Governorate to accommodate 1,000 IDP families before the end of 2023.
- Development of Technical Standards: Through dedicated TWiGs and consultations with sub-national authorities, the shelter sector facilitated the development of guidelines and SoPs for 1) cash for minor repair, 2) cash for rent, and 3) adaptation of collective shelters to fit the emerged needs and situation. The documents will be shared with the line ministry and with partners to harmonize response across the affected governorates.
- SHF 2nd Reserve Allocation: 6 shelter projects, out of 9 submitted, met the set criteria and received a total of 3M USD. The two reserve allocations together increased the funding level for shelter EQ response by 7.5M USD.
- 2023 HRP Review: An annex to the 2023 HRP was drafted by the ISG to reflect EQ 500M USD appeal. Total shelter target has been increased by 14% and funding requirement by 35%.

Coordination & Planning - Regular Program

- 2024 HNO/ HRP: The HCT awaits approval to conduct a MSNA in GoS areas, as such, sectors are currently preparing alternative methodologies, including use of secondary data and expert validation.
- In 2024, the HPC will shift from a project based to a hybrid methodology, combining activity-based costing with projectbased cost approaches. The Shelter Sector is revising the latest agreed unit rates per activity for shelter projects calculations.
- Official Approvals: An official endorsement of the shelter sector comprehensive plan was received and shared with partners at the end of April. Partners were advised to initiate vulnerability and technical assessments to be completed within two months.

GAPS / CHALLENGES

- limited access to the EQ damage assessment carried out by GoS affects the shelter response planning.
- Significant economic decline coupled with price fluctuation has resulted in a decreasing scope and/or target of shelter projects.
- Diminishing coping capacities of both IDPs and host communities as well as limited financial resources of government and sector




