Total appeal: **66 M USD**

2 M people in need

Secured funds: 27.8 M USD

Funding gap: 38.2 M USD

Able to reach: 882,000 people

Not able to reach with current funds: 1.1 million people

SITUATION OVERVIEW

Long, extremely cold and unpredictable winters in NW Syria cause acute suffering for 2 million people living without adequate shelter. Most people living in old tents in IDP sites without adequate sewage, drainage, electricity or water supply are children.

- **1.8 million** people live in over 1,400 unplanned IDP sites.
- **56%** of people living in IDP sites are children.
- **800,000** people live in old tents.
- **93%** of tents are more than 1 year old.

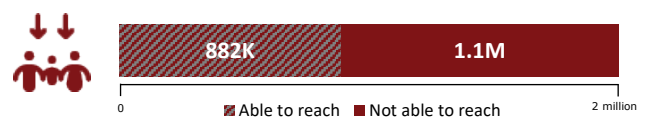
RESPONSE

- Survival level of support only:
 - Children living in old tents will only have 6-8 hours of heat per day in winter.
 - Many households won't be reached due to lack of funds.
- Life-saving winter supplies include:
 - Fuel and stoves
 - Clothes, thermal blankets, mattresses, carpets

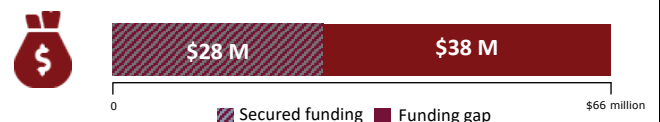
GAPS / CHALLENGES

- Increased risk of flooding, snowstorms, extreme temperatures.

- The current economic crisis reduces purchasing power.

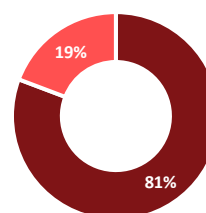
Targeted individuals



Funding status

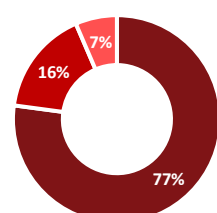


People targeted by location
