Rapid Situation Report - Update No.3

Location(s):	North-Eastern Region
Situation / Needs:	The joint humanitarian assessment teams identified 1050 families as IDPs and requiring assistance in Kunduz province. The joint assessment is ongoing and the number of IDPs is likely to increase. In addition to the 1050 identified families, 91 families were identified by the Joint Assessment Team (JAT). ----- <i>Takhar Province:</i> From the total assessed, 688 families were identified eligible for humanitarian assistance. ----- <i>Baghlan Province</i> The Joint Assessment Team identified 137 families as eligible IDPs for assistance. The population was displaced from Dandi Ghor and Dandi Shahabuddin area to Poli Khumri City. The assessment of Baladori IDPs (approximately 600 families) is ongoing. ----- <i>Badakhshan Province</i> The Joint Assessment Team consisting of UNHCR's partner NPO, WFP, Focus and DoRR have identified 60 conflict affected families in need of humanitarian assistance in Zebak District of Badakhshan. 219 families have been identified as IDPs in need in Baharak District.



	A total of 407 families/houses were affected by seasonal flooding/natural disaster: 39 houses/families in Shahri Buzurg District, 112 in Darayem District and 256 in Jurm districts of Badakhshan Province. The assessment in Baharak of Badakhshan was concluded on the 28 of May 2017 and the response for 219 families is to be decided.
Responses:	<i>Kunduz Province</i> 665 families were assisted with FI, NFI and Hygiene kits by NRC, DACAR, SCI and WFP. 385 families are planned to be assisted by ACTED, DACAR, NRC and WFP during coming week. NRC was unable to provide NFIs to 20 families as they could not produce their national ID cards (Tazkira) or the NRC token. NRC and the Protection Cluster are following up to understand if these families were assessed during the joint assessment. For the additional 91 families, NRC has committed to respond to 46 families (where their staff were present at the JAT). ----- <i>Takhar Province</i> UNHCR dispatched NFIs to locations where 688 families were identified in need. 543 families received food from WFP and NFIs from UNHCR. The remaining 145 families are waiting to be assisted when WFP food supplies arrive and the families requested to receive the NFI packages at the same time. Mission East (MI) also provided hygienic kits for the entire population. ----- <i>Baghlan Province</i> ACTED distributed 18000/AFA for FI+NFIs and cash for rent for 137 conflict affected IDP families in Poli Khumri. ACTED confirmed that they have sufficient capacity to respond to the needs in Baghlan Province. -----



	<i>Badakhshan Province</i> IOM responded with NFIs to 39 flood affected families in Shahri Buzurg and 112 in Darayem. WFP provided food assistance. This population was not in need of Emergency Shelter (ES). 256 families in Jurm are awaiting assistance and IOM have committed to provide NFIs and emergency shelter for 147 families. (ANDMA has 2500 tents in their stock for populations affected by natural disasters).
Gaps / Constraints:	Partners are planning to assist the remaining 45 families in Kunduz who are in need of Food, NFI and Hygiene kits.
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
