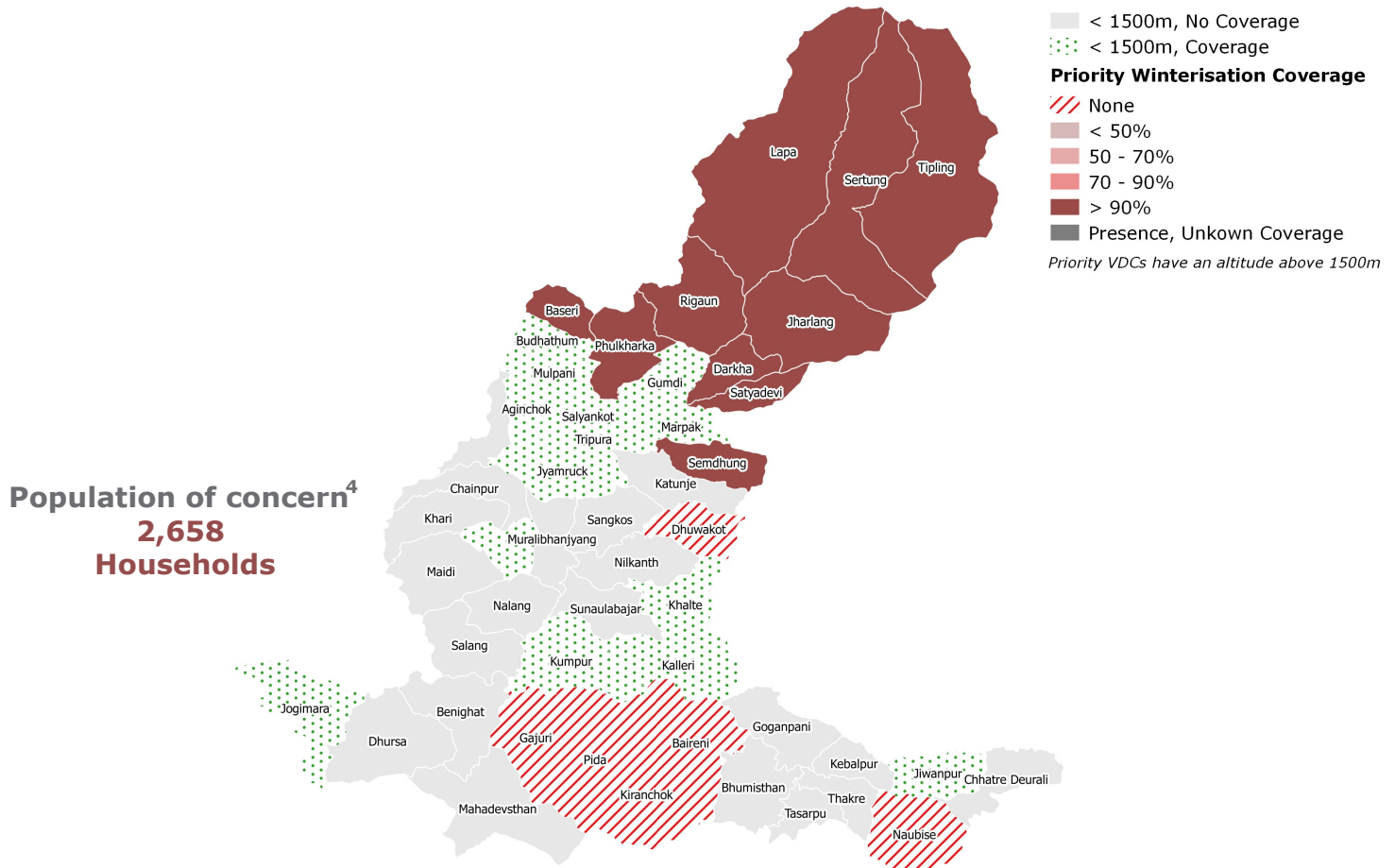

## Current Situation

- Distribution of Blankets and other winter items has been completed in 9541 HHS.
- Distribution of winter kit by OXFAM, DCA and Save the Children to 8434 HHs is ongoing. It is supposed to be completed by the end of December.
- Regarding the confirmed plan of various agencies, 12540 HHs will be assisted by either voucher, in kind or cash in coming week.

## Background

Dhading is one of the highly affected districts by the earthquake according to the number of damaged households. Although Dhading was poorly covered by emergency shelter relief (only 58% of the affected households received a tarpaulin or a tent), the distribution of CGI or its equivalent in cash (15,000 NPRs, mostly by the government) reached more than 90% of the affected population.
