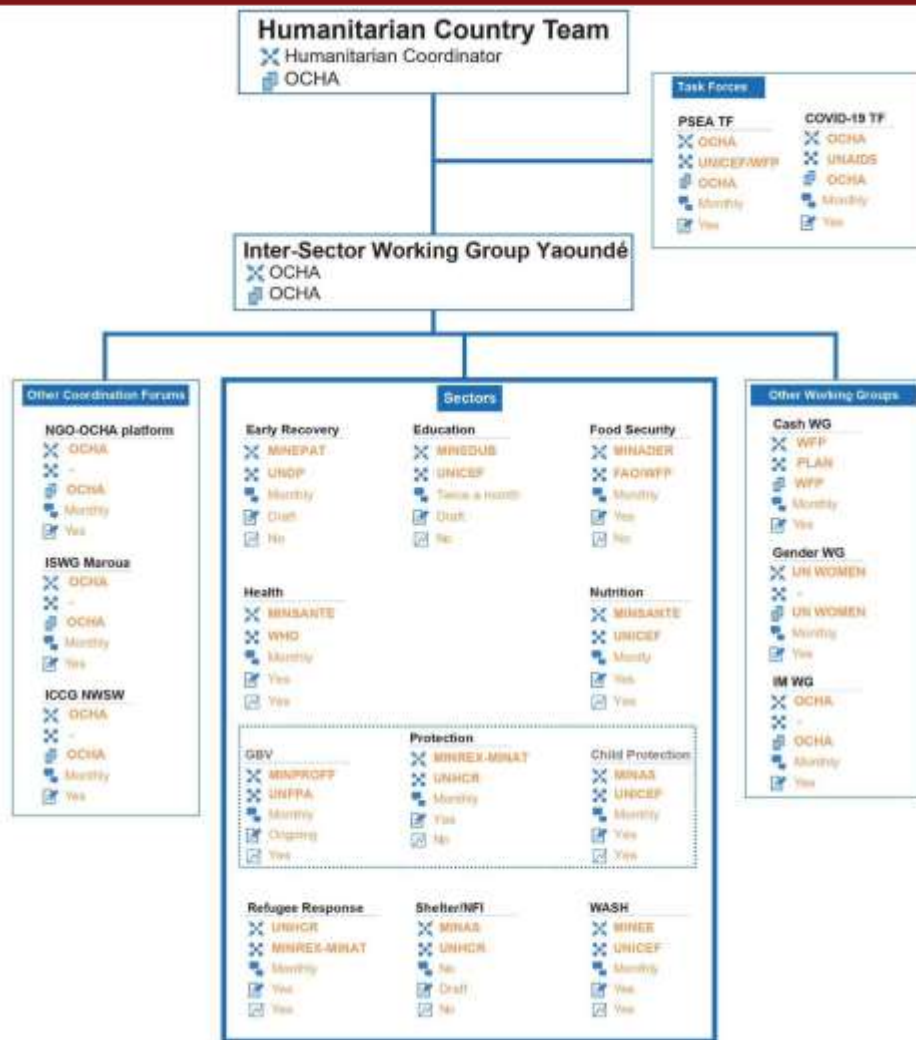

National Level YAOUNDE

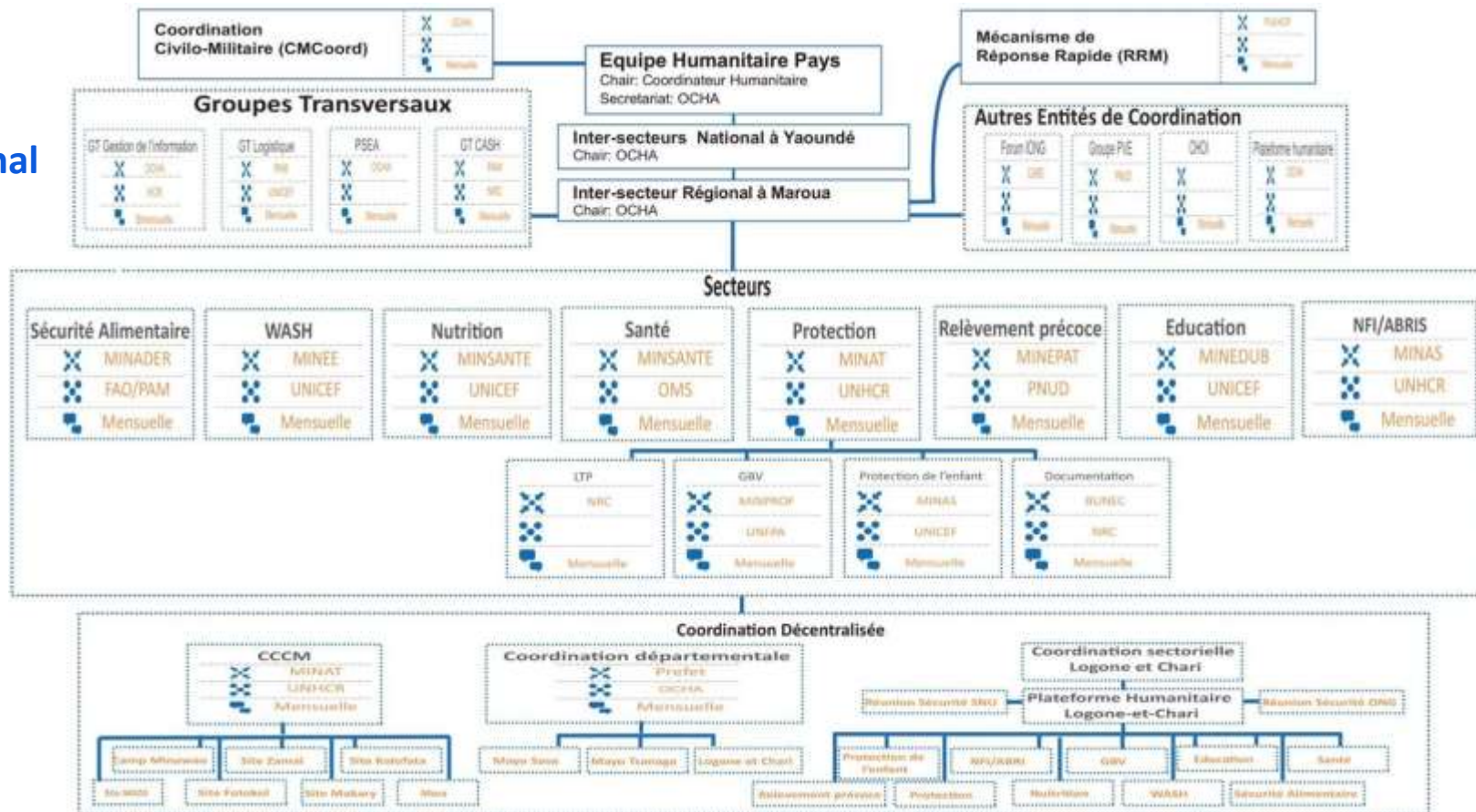


Sub-National Level North West - South West Regions

Cameroon continues to be affected by three protection crises and concurrent complex humanitarian situations:

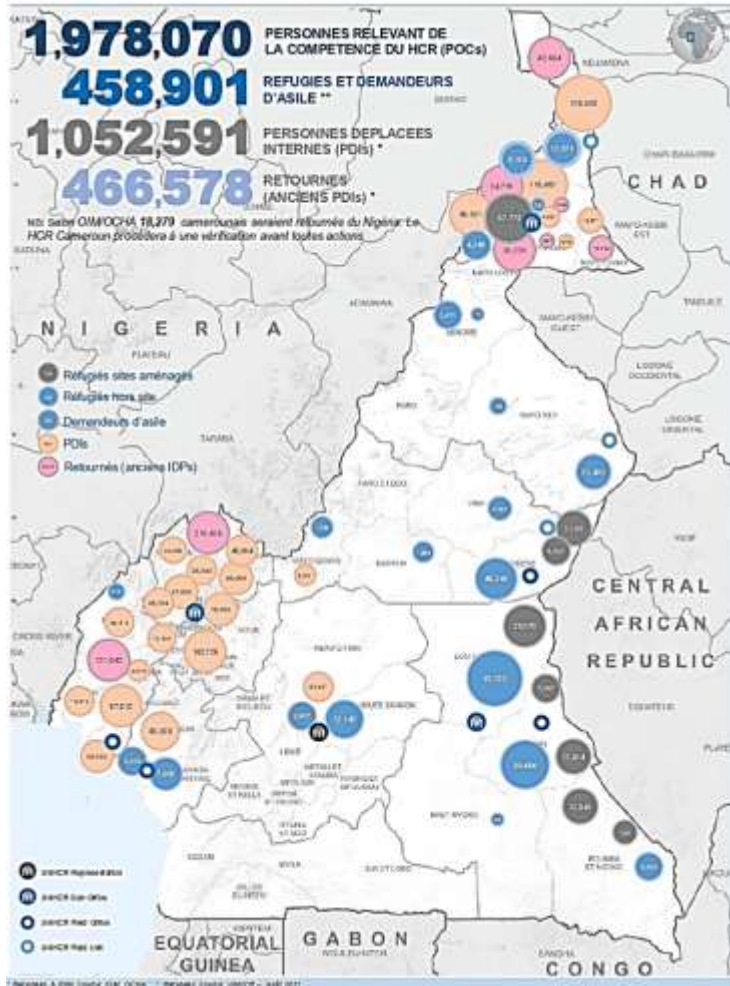
- **Displacement caused by continuous violence in the Lake Chad Basin;**
- **Displacement caused by armed conflict between Defense and Security Forces (GDSF) and Non-State Armed Groups (NSAG) in the North-West and South-West regions. 700.000 people displaced since beginning of the crisis.**
- **The presence of over 290,000 refugees from the Central African Republic (CAR) in the eastern regions (East, Adamawa and North).**

Overview of the context



IDPs

- 45% is living in hosting families
- 21% is self-settled in rural areas
- 20% is renting accommodations
- 14% is makeshift shelters

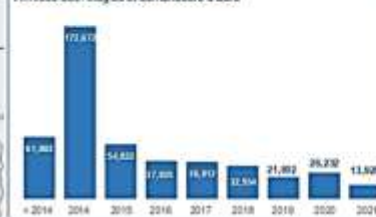

Overview of the response (June 2021)



- PIN 1,5 M
- 185,000 people reached from a total planned target of 700,000 people
- Main reach is through core relief items (7%) and emergency shelter kits (9%)
- Critically underfunded plan. As per today only 20% funded with shelter sector funded at 7% (!!)
- 10 active partners (IEDA RELIEF, NRC, DRC, ACF, IRC, PUBLIC CONCERN, PLAN, COHESODEC, SHUMAS, INTERSOS)

The response plan (October – December 2021)



- Emergency shelter provision (in-kind/e-vouchers/ mobile money)
- T-shelter construction (NRC/IOM)
- NFI kits distribution or enhance access to NFI (in-kind, e-voucher, mobile money)
- Rental subsidy

The coordination planned actions (October – December 2021 and 2022)



- Co-chair
- Sector needs assessment NWSW (STEP UP funds)
- IM dedicated resources (STEP UP funds)
- Strengthen IM tools
- Evidence-based fund-raising campaign

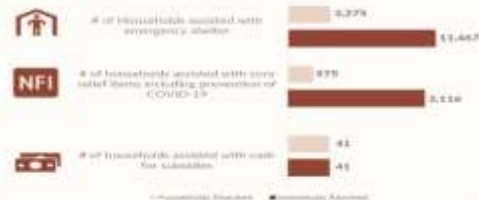
Individual Reached Trend



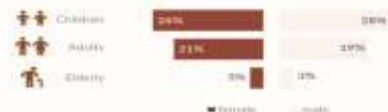

Coordination

- Update of Shelter Cluster Key Diagnostic update of Shelter Cluster Strategic and Tofu for Shelter Technical Working Group
- Discussion ongoing with North West authority about banned items within the shelter kits and support needed from Yaounde to continue advocating with Ministry of Territorial Administration
- Funding to respond to shelter/NFI needs in NWSW and protected items within the shelter kits remained the main challenges of cluster partners.



- During the month of June in the North-West region more than 15,000 people got displaced. Most of them need NFI assistance and shelter and 60% among them won't receive any type of relief support.
- In the Far North region the majority of the people staying at the informal settlement sites are in need of shelter materials (plastic tarpaulins, shelter tools) and did not receive any assistance since more than one year.

* In the North-West and South-West regions as of today the ShelterBilt response could cover only 8% of the population in need by reaching the 10% of the people planned to be assisted under the Humanitarian Response Plan 2021 mainly with emergency shelters through five partners (NRC, DRC, Plan International, HELMUS, CODE SODICIS).

- In the Far North during the first semester of 2021, the response could reach only the 10% of the people planned to assist under the Humanitarian Response Plan 2021 mainly with core food items through the partners (FARDC, DRCG, AAGDC, MRC, ACF).

- Access is becoming more difficult for humanitarian actors in the north-west region due to increase in violence
- According to the NRC report 'The world's most neglected crisis', published in May 2021, political inaction is the international media attention is waning fast and many people are left without any humanitarian assistance to meet their most urgent needs in Cameroon

Challenges

- Access in the NWSW
- Transitional shelter solutions in NWSW
- Fundraising
Cameroon as part of the region in pooled allocations
- The double threat;
Humanitarians engaging in longer term plan (NEXUS/authorities' plans) are not welcome in the NWSW
- Political, peace negotiations efforts are limited
- In 2020 50% of working days lost (GHOST TOWN effect)
